- An independent all-male Roman Catholic school, Central Catholic High School was founded in 1852 by the Society of Mary (Marianist) Priests and Brothers.
- Faculty and staff includes **10 Marianist** Priests and Brothers.
- **157 years** of Catholic education taught in the Marianist tradition...Central Catholic is the oldest high school for young men in Texas.
- **\$8,595** - Tuition (Includes text books and fees)

- **45 percent** of students receive tuition assistance and scholarships to attend Central Catholic. Last year, that amount was \$586,510.
- **Academics:** Well-rounded educational experience with rigorous academics especially in math and science with strong spiritual development. National Merit Scholarships are regularly awarded.
- **Athletics:** 10 varsity sports — football, basketball, baseball, soccer, golf, tennis, swimming, lacrosse, cross country, track and field
- **Campus Ministry:** Focuses on student retreats — 1 for freshmen, 2 for sophomores, 2 for juniors and two Kairos retreats for seniors.
- **Community Service:** Students completed 29,600 hours of service with such organizations as Habitat for Humanity and Seton Home. They also conducted four blood drives last year. In addition, students conduct Marianist Mission Drives to support Marianist missions in Mexico, India and Africa.
- **Band:** Award-winning band offers marching and concert band, music ensembles and jazz band (won sweepstakes 15 out of the past 16 years).
- **JROTC:** A nationally recognized leadership and character training program
- Member of the **Marianist Educational Consortium** consisting of 22 colleges and high schools in the U.S. and Puerto Rico
- Accredited by the **Southern Association of Colleges and Schools** and by the **Texas Catholic Conference Education Department**.
