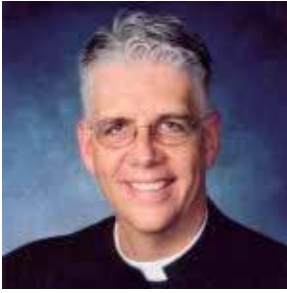


Fr. Bill Meyer, S.M. (Assistant for Religious Life)



Fr. Bill, 62, professed first vows in 1967 and was ordained in 1979. He has a bachelor's degree from St. Mary's University in San Antonio, a master's degree in religious education from Seattle University, master of divinity from the University of St. Michael's College (Toronto) and a doctorate of ministry in clinical pastoral counseling from Andover Newton Theological School in Massachusetts.

Bro. Francisco González, S.M. (Councilor; liaison to the District of Mexico)



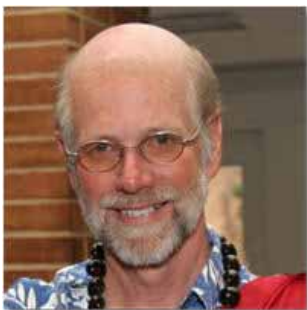
