What: Saint Louis School will hold a ground-breaking ceremony for the construction of the Clarence T.C. Ching Learning and Technology Center. The structure will be the first

new academic facility on campus in 80 years and will feature classrooms and laboratories for technology as well as programs in Hawaiian studies, visual arts, digital media, music, and the soon-to-be-established business leadership program. Construction of the three-story, 27,000-square foot building will begin in late October 2009, with completion slated for January 2011.

Background: Saint Louis School received a \$5.2 million donation from the Clarence T.C. Ching Foundation for the construction of the new center, which will enhance academic programs and educational opportunities for students and faculty. The school also received contributions from many donors, including school alumni and friends in the community. Plans for the center were first drafted when Mamiya T. Theater was built in 1985, but were unused. Current construction partners include the architect, Design Partners, and general contractor, A.C. Kobayashi.

Founded in 1846, Saint Louis School is a private school for boys in grades five through 12 that educates and challenges students to become gentlemen of character who reach their full potential through the Catholic Marianist tradition of spiritual, academic, physical, and emotional maturity. Its motto, “Memor et Fidelis,” (Mindful and Faithful) underscores its emphasis on spiritual growth, critical thinking, and strong moral character and its commitment to educating leaders in all walks of life.
