


Chaminade Day Morning Prayer







now and always and forever and ever.**




With psalm 90 we invoke the mercy of Christ on our lives, past and future.



At evening we dry up and wither away.




In the tender compassion of our God,


Canticle of Zechariah

born of the house of your ser-vant David.




Through your holy prophets, you prom-ised of old

Psalm Prayer



Let us pray Psalm 1 remembering The Cross of Christ, The Tree of Life, and The Font of Baptism




