First, there are a few ground rules.

1. All completed tasks must be returned to the Main Office. Decisions on successful completion is made final by Ms. Meinking and Mrs. Mullholland
2. Only one person from each Base Community is allowed to leave the room to do official task business in the Main Office. A different person must be sent each time. All other members must remain in the room.
3. No running in the halls!
4. If a task is incomplete or incorrect, it will be returned to the Base Community to be completed successfully.
5. Base Communities can be disqualified if they choose to cheat, break the rules, or tamper with another team's completion of any task.

- 2) Education: This group will create a picture, poster, or symbol in honor of the Marianists and Sisters of Charity who are currently members of the PMHS staff.
- 3) Family Spirit: This group will draw a picture or write a poem to show how family spirit is demonstrated at PMHS.
- 4) Service, Justice and Peace: This group will also draw a picture or write a poem to show how this characteristic is demonstrated at PMHS.
- 5) Adaptation and Change: This group will create a sign/poster/flyer that displays a message to PMHS students on how they can make changes that will continue to make all of us *Outstanding Among All*.
