Opening Scripture

Reflection Questions

Introduction

How would you define the word "Missionary" after reading the introduction?

"Do Whatever He Tells You"

Bernard Lee, SM, often encourages communities to pray in community with the Gospel in one hand and the newspaper in the other. (*Habits for the Journey*). What are the signs of the times for us today?

How do you interpret "Do whatever he tells you" as you consider your work as a board member?

Life: The Marianist Vocation

How does support each member in identifying his/her gifts?

How do your gifts contribute to the building of the "Body of Christ" on the board?

Describe a community or group that you have witnessed that "[shone] forth as a source of light which [made] them the object of general attention"?

How can we be missionaries in ordinary as well as extraordinary times (as individuals and as communities)?
