Stories can be the glue that binds families together. Stories explain – sometimes with wit and wisdom – how important events and relationships connect people with each other.

With this in mind, **Patti Gehred** and **Sr. Gabrielle Bibeau**, employees of the [North American Center for Marianist Studies](#), decided to record Marianist stories from attendees at the summer Lay Assembly and turn them into podcasts.

The idea, which was inspired in part by National Public Radio's *StoryCorp* project, took flight when WYSO, a public radio station serving Southwest Ohio, agreed to help with the recording sessions.

More than 30 people – some as young as 22, others as old as 90, both lay and religious – showed up to tell their stories during the assembly.

"It was an extraordinary and humbling experience to hear people's stories," said Sr. Gabrielle. "There is an emotional intimacy conveyed in audio like no other."

The stories are being edited into podcasts for a series called *Sharing our Marianist Stories*. "We are scheduling more recording sessions in the future. This is an ongoing project," said Patti.

How do we respond to events like the violence in Charlottesville and terror attacks in Spain?

While our hearts are once again broken with this recent eruption of racism and violence, our natural



instinct as members of the Marianist Family is to turn to prayer and community. Prayer, because we know that God is the author and sustainer of all life. It is in prayer that we grow in the confidence needed to respond. Community, because it provides the framework we need to discern the appropriate response.

How do we learn and grow from these events?

When we spend time in prayer and in faith-sharing community, we'll realize the need for a spirituality for charity and justice. The Church's rich tradition of [social teaching](#) has never been more crucial or timely. It will prove to be an effective plan of learning and growth.

Where do we find hope?

We find hope in the real presence of Christ when we gather in community, desiring to respond as he did with justice and love to all situations. And there is always hope in the goodness and heroism of our brothers and sisters who in the midst of sinful chaos continue to reach out in love.

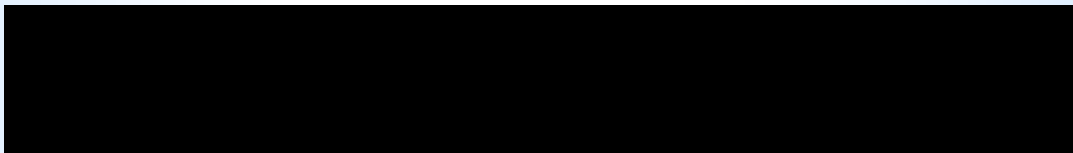

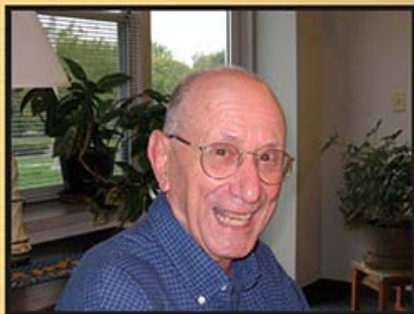
ST. MARY'S HIGH SCHOOL RECEIVES SURPRISE \$2.5 MILLION GIFT

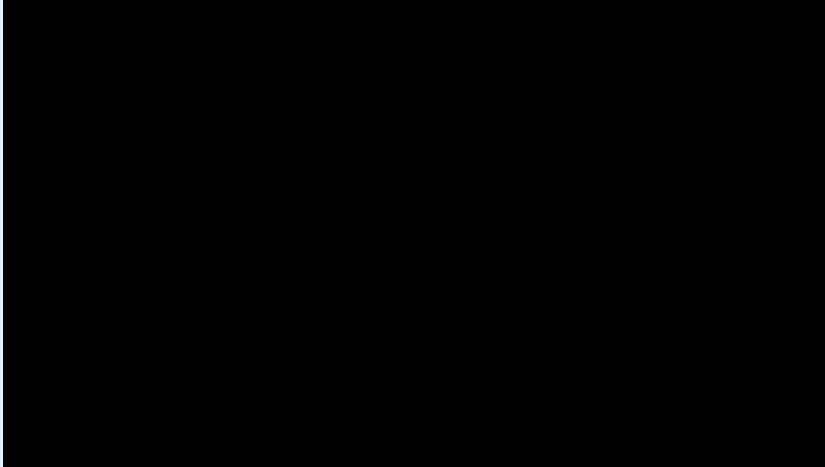

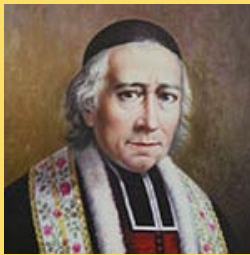

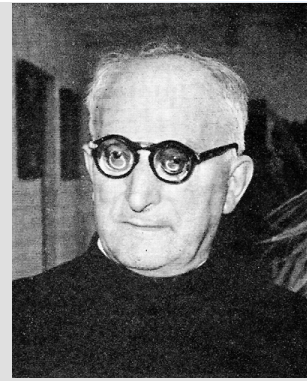

MARIANIST MOMENT: **Fr. Vicente López de Uralde**

*This is part of a series on Marianists who are on the path to sainthood. We thank **Bro. David Betz** and Marianist Affiliate **Mary Kay Fitzpatrick** for preparing these articles.*

Fr. Vicente López de Uralde was born in Vitoria, Spain, in 1894, and died Sept. 15, 1990, in Cádiz, Spain.

He professed first vows as a Marianist in 1911 and was ordained in 1925. He dedicated his life in service to the people of Cádiz.



Nicknamed “the confessor of Cádiz,” Fr. Vicente dedicated the greatest part of his time to the ministry of the sacrament of reconciliation with the children and adults who would approach him for reconciliation with God. This work was a priority in his priestly life, a “priestly zeal that consumed him.”

Bishop Anoveros asked him, “Why does half of Cádiz confess with you?” He responded with his familiar good humor: “It might be because of my blindness, Bishop, and if I were deaf, perhaps the other half would come, too.” [Read the article.](#)
