NEW LEADERS NAMED FOR MARIANISTS IN U.S. PROVINCE

Fr. Oscar Vasquez has been named the new provincial of the Marianist Province of the United States. He will be joined at the helm by **Bro. Bernard Ploeger** as assistant provincial. The pair will assume these top leadership roles on Aug. 1, 2018.

Fr. Oscar, 54, will take the reins from Fr. Martin Solma, who has served in the role since 2010. A native of San Antonio, Fr. Oscar attended Central Catholic High School.

He professed first vows as a Marianist in 1987 and was ordained in 2007. He has a bachelor's degree from Our Lady of the Lake University and a masters from the University of St. Thomas.

Fr. Oscar has served as a teacher and principal at Marianist high schools in Texas and is currently the chaplain at <u>Chaminade College Preparatory</u> in St. Louis, while also ministering as associate pastor at <u>Our Lady of the Pillar Parish</u>.

Bro. Bernie, 69, was raised in Cincinnati and attended <u>Archbishop Moeller High School</u>. He professed first vows as a Marianist in 1967. He has a bachelor's degree from the University of Dayton, and master's and doctorate degrees from The Ohio State University. Most recently, he served as president of <u>Chaminade University of Honolulu</u>. Bro. Bernie will assume the role from **Bro. Joseph Kamis**, who has served in the position since 2010.

The Marianists have a fairly lengthy consultation process for choosing provincial leaders. Province members make detailed nominations to the General Administration in Rome, which makes the final determination. The provincial and assistant provincial serve for five years, and with approval, may continue for an additional three years.

All ordinations in the Society of Mary are occasions to celebrate. But as **Bro. Armando José Añeses** stepped to the altar on Nov. 25 to embrace his call to priestly ministry, the blessings were accompanied with a heightened sense of joy. That's because the ordination – originally scheduled for Sept. 23 in San Juan, Puerto Rico – was postponed. Hurricane Maria had struck three days earlier, devastating the island.

Even in late November, only about half of Puerto Rico had electricity. But that didn't stop nearly 250 friends, family members, and Marianist brothers and priests from gathering at <u>Colegio San José</u> to celebrate Fr. Armando.

The Most Reverend Roberto González-Nieves, OFM, Archbishop of San Juan, presided at the ordination.

Fr. Armando, 51, professed first vows in the Society of Mary in 2006 and earned a bachelor's degree in history and a master's degree in educational leadership from University of Dayton. He attended Chaminade International Seminary while studying theology at the Pontifical Gregorian University of Rome.

Linda Hayes joined the staff of the Marianist Mission in 2004 and became its director in 2010. The Marianist Mission, established in 1961, is located in Dayton.


What does the Marianist Mission do?

At its heart, the Marianist Mission is a ministry. People contact us by phone or through the mail or the website to request prayers, Mass enrollments and seasonal cards.

We receive about 225,000 prayer requests each year, and we commit to some 200,000 perpetual enrollments.*

What's the biggest challenge the Mission faces?

We provide important outreach that supports the faith life of our friends and donors, many of whom have a special devotion to Mary. Many of these folks are older. So, our challenge is to keep finding and engaging new friends. We need to remain relevant as the Catholic population changes.





CONVERSATION, NOT CONFRONTATION AT STMU YELLOW BENCH



St. Mary's students share their thoughts on the yellow bench, which has been established as a place for those with differing views to learn from each other.

There's a yellow park bench on the campus of <u>St. Mary's University</u>. Sometimes it's over *there*. Sometimes it's over *there*. But it's always a place to have a conversation – maybe even a hard one.

The moveable bench was the brainchild of students in the <u>Marianist Leadership Program</u> at St. Mary's, said **Brian Buchmeyer**, MLP coordinator. "They wanted to create a free-speech zone where people with differing viewpoints can safely share their concerns." In a society increasingly oriented to angry confrontation, the bench is a place for open conversation.

Recently, MLP students invited peers living in the U.S. under DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals) to talk about the impact of decisions pending in Congress. These foreignborn students have until March 2018 for Congress to reauthorize their permits, or many will face deportation. St. Mary's has roughly 100 DACA students among its 2,300 undergraduate students.

Jocelyn Baca, a DACA student and a Marianist Leadership Program participant, said that with the support of the St. Mary's community, she feels safe to talk about her undocumented status. "If it wasn't for St. Mary's spirit and sense of welcoming, I never would have openly shared my story."

CHAMINADE JULIENNE NAMED DAYTON'S 'BUSINESS OF THE YEAR'



The school family of <u>Chaminade Julienne Catholic High School</u> was pleased enough to be named the "Best Nonprofit Business of the Year" by the *Dayton Business Journal*. But the accolades at the awards ceremony last month didn't end there. As the



Mother Adèle

This Marianist Moment centers on Marianist Family founder **Adèle de Batz de Trenquelléon**, who will be beatified on June 10, 2018.

Adèle was born into an aristocratic family in France in 1789, and from a young age, had a dedication to prayer and to serving the poor. At age 15, she and a few friends began a prayer association they called the "little society." It grew to include several hundred young women. Adèle met **Fr. William Joseph Chaminade** when she was just 19. With his help, she founded the Marianist Sisters in 1816. <u>Read more</u>.
