

Celebrating Ad è le's Beatification

Sr. Laura Leming, FMI (assistant for religious life for the Marianist Sisters) invites all Marianist friends, colleagues and collaborators to join in celebrating the Beatification of **Adèle de Batz de Trenquelléon** on June 10, 2018. Adèle is the foundress of the Marianist Sisters and Father Chaminade's collaborator.

Beatification is a declaration by the Pope as head of the Church that a deceased person lived a holy life and is worthy of public veneration. It is also an official statement by the Church that this holy one can stand before God as our intercessor. At this point, we can insert the name of the holy one in the cannon/Eucharistic prayer asking his/her intercession before God. Beatified persons are called "Blessed."
