## **New Measures with Hope**



### **Bro. Lucian Tigga, Office of Temporalities.**

We Marianists in the District are committed to render our services to the poor and the vulnerable. We devote our welfare programs to the villagers, street children, and slum dwellers to improve their standard of living. We strive to empower them to become contributing citizens of society, by providing educational activities, skill training, and self-help programs, thus enabling them to live with dignity and purpose. Without discrimination, we welcome children of all backgrounds to our programs for succeeding in the mainstream of society.

After the outbreak of Covid-19, the District Administrative team planned together to assist the people with Covid relief. We approached local authorities and sought their permission to distribute food grains, masks, and sanitizers. From the Office of Temporalities, a circular was circulated to the social ministry directors about the urgency to eradicate and prevent the spread of Covid-19. I sincerely applaud the ministry directors and community Brothers for their quick and positive response. Several awareness programs were conducted in vernacular languages though our social ministries about crucial aspects like prevention, hygiene, and social distancing isolation. We provided shelters in our school campus especially to the migrant construction workers.

Vigorously, our Brothers did justice by distributing masks and food grains to the slum dwellers, villagers, and migrant workers. Our social wings made a valuable contribution during the outbreak of this pandemic, reaching the needy in a timely manner. We shall continue our good works assisting the poor and the vulnerable, as Fr. Chaminade tirelessly assisted the people of his time.

#### **REDS Ranchi**

The ongoing pandemic has interrupted the normal activities of everyone, and it has forced us to stop our regular activities too. For this reason, REDS Ranchi has stopped running day care centres, seminars, workshops, and health care works. The pandemic led many REDS families to suffer severely from hunger, because their livelihood is dependent upon their daily wages, begging, and rag-picking. They were not able to leave their homes due the lockdown. A good many REDS children's parents started making phone calls to REDS centre coordinators and shared with them that they were suffering from starvation. Many feared death by hunger, not from Covid.

Bro. Paulus Lakra, the director of the program, and the centre's coordinators came together to find the ways and means to help the REDS families. With the support of the District Administration, Bro. Paulus and his staff enthusiastically started to distribute food provisions, cleaning supplies, medications, and facemasks to the REDS families who live in 12 different slums of Ranchi. The food materials were packed and distributed to each family of REDS children as well as other poor and needy families in the REDS areas. With these food distributions from the month of April till now, the Brothers and the staff continued to assist the people in various ways. So far, REDS Ranchi has distributed food materials to nearly 3,027 families, who are very grateful for the care and support shown to them during these difficult times.

# **REDS Bengaluru**

During the time of national lockdown, REDS Bengaluru dedicated its service to the slum dwellers in vulnerable conditions in the various parts of Bengaluru. In March and April, twenty-four staff in twelve groups went house-to-house in the slums to raise awareness on the importance of hygiene, wearing masks, maintaining social distance, and sanitation. They provided the people all the information about Covid-19. Due to the lockdown, many people were left without food because many of them are dependent upon their daily wages. Many of them lost their jobs and were left in hunger and poverty. Hence REDS Bengaluru stretched its helping hands to the slum dwellers in association with the District Administration and the friends of REDS.

Initially, REDS started to distribute groceries to the places where people suffered greatly due to the complete lockdown. Then from the month of May onwards, REDS Bangaluru has distributed groceries, food provisions, vegetables, and hygiene kits to various slums in Bengaluru. Bro. Showraiah Ravulapalli, the director of REDS Bengaluru, says that so far they have distributed such supplies to 2,718 families.

Additionally, the Brothers and staff have distributed fruit juice, facemasks, and cleaning supplies to the people. All of the play schools and daycare centres are shut during these days, based upon the advice of the government. The beneficiaries are very grateful to the Brothers for their valuable assistance during the lockdown.

#### **REDS Patna**

Bro. Antony Nesam, the director of Maria Nilaya Community, says that his community has taken an active part in easing the pain of the local people during the time of lockdown. In April, he assisted the local welfare authorities to identify the people who needed food provisions and other assistance. Many people benefited from the food distribution of local welfare authorities. In May and June, twice he organized food distributions to 150 people from funds of the Marianist District Administration. The community members and volunteers assisted him with the smooth food distributions. Most of the beneficiaries are coolie workers. Some of them are widows, cancer patients, migrant workers, and elderly persons. They are extremely grateful to the Brothers for their assistance in time of need, and some beneficiaries expressed that these relief materials brought hope and light to their huts.
