Recently, the General Council conducted a consultation regarding the appointment of the next Regional Superior of the Region of Eastern Africa. Responses arrived from almost all members of the Region.

In its meeting of February 18, 2021, the Superior General, with the support of the General Council, appointed Father Stephen Wanyoike Mburu, SM, as the next Regional Superior of Eastern Africa. We are very grateful to Father Stephen for his willingness to serve the Region and the Society of Mary, as leader of the Region of Eastern Africa.



Father Stephen is born on April 25, 1973 in Kenya. He made his first vows on August 1, 1998 in Nairobi, Kenya. On January 22, 2005, he pronounced his perpetual vows. After three years at the Chaminade International Seminary in Rome, Italy, he was ordained marianist priest on October 24, 2009 in Nairobi, Kenya.

Father Steven will begin his first term of five years on May 23, 2021.

We would also like to thank Fr. Gabriel Kirangah, SM, and his Council for their years of service.

Meeting of the Superiors of the Africa Zone in Lomé - Togo

After several postponements and hesitations related to the health restrictions in force in the different countries, the meeting of the African Marianist Conference (CAM), initially scheduled for early November 2020, was able to take place, with its annual dialogue and exchange, in Lomé (Togo), from February 22 to 24, 2021. This meeting saw the effective participation of the four Unit Superiors of the Africa Zone, which includes the Regions of Eastern Africa and Togo, the District of Ivory Coast and the Sector of Congo.

In anticipation of the canonical visit of the General Council to the Region of Togo, scheduled from February 28 to March 21, Bro. Maximin Magnan, Assistant General for Education, arrived a week earlier, in order to be able to take part in this meeting and accompany the four superiors of these Units in their work.

Starting next summer, the composition of this zonal conference will be greatly changed, because three quarters of the Unit Superiors will have finished their terms and will be replaced by other persons. The fruits of the present meeting, which focused on the collaborations that are underway in the area and that could evolve into "common projects", will therefore constitute, as a starting point, the work of the


On the way to Easter with Faustino
