



Marianist LIFE Summer 2022 Program Guidelines Related to COVID-19

These Marianist LIFE summer program COVID-19 guidelines are based on various policies established by each institution, program site, the Marianist Province of the United States, state and federal guidelines. We are aware of the variety of policies related to the pandemic. These guidelines are created with the intention of care and respect for protecting the program participants, staff and families. We will continue to develop and adapt our policy as necessary. Parents are responsible for checking and complying with these requirements and ultimately, making the best, informed decision regarding the participation of your child, including potential transportation, housing and testing fees.

In order to do what we can to prevent Covid spread at the summer program:

- According to CDC guidelines, we strongly encourage all students and adults be fully vaccinated
- We require each institution submit proof of negative Covid tests for all participants (students and adults) *taken within 48 hours of travel.*
- In addition, students must test negative on a rapid antigen test at school or the drop-off location before guardians leave the property - local moderator will fill out form to submit to LIFE to indicate completion of testing. Any adults traveling to program must complete the same testing.
- If a student has tested positive for Covid within 90 days of travel to the summer program and continues to test positive, the student must present a doctor's note stating that they are cleared from quarantine and able to participate

What do we do if there is a positive case?

- Should someone test positive at the program, CDC guidelines will be followed. If a student should test positive for Covid-19 while at the summer program and the student has not traveled to program by plane, the parent should arrange to pick up their student immediately. If a student who has traveled by plane tests positive while at the summer program, the guardians and the school or parish should work together to determine the best course of action regarding travel arrangements.

Masking

- Programs will follow local and CDC guidelines regarding masks at summer program. Coordinating teams will provide updates regarding mask policies at individual programs.
