Dear Mr. Willett:

I wish to thank you for giving me the benefit of your views concerning the bill passed by the House of Representatives to provide Federal aid to the public schools.

As you know, I have often spoken out in favor of our private school system. There is always a possibility that constitutional measures will be worked out to help such schools, since today they face increasing financial difficulties. But I would be reluctant at this moment to support any specific means, pending a more careful study of the constitutional situation. Federal and state courts have placed rather severe limitations upon aid to private schools, especially religious schools.
