A Marian reflection introducing the second CME, "Provide an integral, quality education."

Embrace Mary as a model of integrity.

Mary lived her life as a woman of integrity, faithful to her God and to her mission. Her entire being was and is focused on bringing Christ into the world. All we know of her life reflects this purpose. Mary was the first educator of Jesus. She brought together God's revelation and her human reason in order to nurture Jesus for the fullness of his mission. Marianist educators look to her maternal concern for the integral development of Jesus as our model for nurturing the development of our students, preparing them to face the realities of the world with integrity and a deep and broad competence.

Silent Introspection

Let us spend a few minutes in silence, introspecting personally on the following descriptors.

Providing an Integral, Quality Education requires:

a) Board members who . . .

- ✓ support quality education of the whole person.
- ✓ understand the need to provide coherent curricula; a well-formed, professional, administration, faculty, and staff; and adequate facilities and finances.
- \checkmark respect the dignity of the person as a daughter or son of God, unique and individual
- ✓ develop an interior spirit and self-knowledge.
- \checkmark develop a concern for global and local issues of culture, ecology, and the use of technology.
- ✓ understand the value of a diverse faculty and staff as well as a diverse student body.

b) A Board that . . .

- ✓ recognizes complexities and subtleties in the issues it faces and draws upon multiple
 perspectives to dissect complex problems and to synthesize appropriate responses.
- ✓ approaches problems from a broad institutional outlook.
- ✓ searches widely for concrete information and actively seeks different viewpoints from multiple constituencies.
- ✓ consciously creates opportunities for trustee education and development.
- ✓ regularly seeks information and feedback on its own performance.
- ✓ pauses periodically for self-reflection, to diagnose its strengths and limitations.
- √ tolerates ambiguity and recognizes that complex matters rarely yield to perfect solutions.
