## The Process of Canonization and Updates on a couple of our Holy Marianists

From what we read and know about the canonization process, it can be long, arduous, and expensive. Evidence of this can be seen in reading various resources such as 'Give Us This Day's" section, Blessed Among Us, which gives the dates when the saints and blesseds died and when they were declared saints and blessed. For example, our Marianist founders, Blessed Chaminade, died in January 1850 and was beatified in September 2000 and Blessed Marie of the Conception Adèle de Batz de Trenquelléon died in January 1828 and was beatified in June 2018. It is amazing that religious families, such as our own and other groups who support these causes, diligently engage in the process despite the time and effort it takes. I believe it comes from the determination and the faith of the people involved, who strongly believe that these holy men and women deserve to be recognized formally by the Catholic Church.
