Education and Personality Development Workshop for Tailoring Students at Deepahalli



REDS, the Marianists, successfully organized a one-day workshop for tailoring students on 13 December 2025 at Deepahalli, from 10:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., benefiting around 100 tailoring students. The programme was organized under the leadership of Bro. Antony Nesam, S.M., REDS Programme Director, who also arranged transportation facilities for the students and REDS staff.

The workshop began with a warm welcome by Bro. Antony Nesam, S.M. The guests—Bro. Basant Kujur, Fr. Santhosh Savarimuthu, S.M., Fr. Ignase, S.M., REDS Executive Director, and Bro. Rayappan—were honored, followed by a graceful welcome dance performed by the students of REDS Tailoring Centre No. 3, K.C.C. Nagar, Hosur.



The programme focused on educational development, personality development, and interactive learning. The educational development session was led by Bro. Basant Kujur, who emphasized the importance of focused learning, continuous skill enhancement, proper marking techniques, teamwork, creating one's own brand, starting a tailoring business, updating skills with new designs and models, setting clear goals, and working persistently to achieve them.
